"Inspiring singing voices, Resonating to the true skies"

19 March - 22 March 2026 Fukushima, Japan

The Fukushima Vocal Ensemble Competition is the largest choral competition for small vocal ensemble groups (2-16 singers) in Japan. Every year we invite more than 120 top level choirs selected from all over Japan as well as all around the world to share the joy of singing.

Fukushima is known as the "Kingdom of Choirs" in Japan, which has a large population of music fans and award-winning choirs. You are cordially invited to experience the fascinating atmosphere of our music cities, and let your singing voices ring out together under the sky that a 19th century poet once described as the "True Sky."

Competition Rules

Category

· Category I: Ages 12-15

· Category II: Ages 15-18

· Category III: Ages 6-12 (up to 18)

· Category IV: Other than Category I, II and III

*Ages are determined as the age of the participant on the day of 22 March 2026

*Participants of ages 12-15 (Category I) and ages 15-18 (Category II) may participate in Category III, provided that the majority of the singers of the choir shall be of ages 6-12.

*The participants of ages 12-15 (Category I) and ages 15-18 (Category II) must sing as a children's choir when in Category III.

Qualification

- Entry a. The number of singers should be 2-16 (no fewer than 2 and no more than 16) and member changes between musical pieces will be permitted only among those registered at the time of application.
 - b. No singer shall compete as a member of more than one choir, regardless of the categories. This restriction does not apply to conductors and accompanists.
 - c. Each category can only accept a single choir from the same group.
 - d. No qualification is required for conductors or accompanists.
 - e. Conductors and accompanists will be considered singers when they sing as a part of the choir.
 - The Gold titled choirs in each category shall proceed to the Grand Champion Competition on 22 March.
 - g. In principle, singers who have not registered in the Category Competition may not perform in the Grand Champion Competition.

- Performance a. There is no compulsory piece in any category. All music pieces performed will be determined by the choir. Any change will not be allowed after registration.
 - b. For the Category Competition, the total performance time from the beginning of the first piece until the end of the last piece (including time between songs) must not exceed 9 minutes.
 - c. For the Grand Champion Competition, the total performance time from the beginning of the first piece to the end of the last piece (including time between pieces) must not exceed 15 minutes.
 - d. Tuning musical instruments on stage is included in the performance time.
 - e. Failure to comply with the above rules will result in disqualification.

Performance

- Order of a. The Category-III performance will take place in the first half of the event on 21 March, followed by the Category-IV performance in the second half.
 - b. The order of performance in the Category Competition will be determined by a random lottery conducted by the Executive Committee Office in February 2026.
 - c. The timetable will be posted on the [ENTRIES/SCHEDULE] page of the official website in late February, as shown below.
 - d. The order of performance for the Grand Champion Competition will be posted on the [ENTRIES/SCHEDULE] page of the official website in mid-November, as shown below. URL: https://www.vocalensemble.fukushima.jp/en/entries&schedule.html

- **Accompaniment** a. The instruments and style of accompaniment are at the discretion of each choir.
 - b. A piano (Steinway & Sons), a positive organ and a pipe organ (Marcussen & Søn) will be provided by the Organiser. The pitch of the piano will be A=442Hz.
 - c. If a choir uses musical instruments other than the above, they must bring them on their own and be responsible for all associated expenses.
 - d. If a choir requires a page-turner, they shall make appropriate arrangements.

Evaluation

- **Judging and** a. The following judges will evaluate the competition: Avip Priatna (Conductor), Ichiro Uenishi (Conductor), Tetsuro Hanai (early music performer), Kazuhiro Fukunaga (Conductor), Tsutomu Matsumura (Conductor), Yuta Miyake (Composer), Hideki Motoyama (Conductor)
 - b. The evaluation of each competition will be conducted using a round-robin system specified separately.
 - c. Results of the Category Competition and judges' comments will be mailed to each participating choir after the competition.

Awards

- Prizes and a. The competition will be evaluated for each category, and Gold, Silver, Bronze or Excellence prizes will be awarded to every participating choir in each category.
 - b. In the Category Competition, Gold Prizes will be awarded to the top 5 choirs in each of the respective categories, I, II and IV, and to the top choir in Category III.
 - c. In the Grand Champion Competition, JPY 500,000 will be awarded to the best choir, JPY 300,000 to the 2nd-place winner, JPY 100,000 to the 3rd-place winner and JPY 30,000 to each of the other finalists.
 - d. In addition, an extra prize will be awarded to top-ranking choirs in the Grand Champion Competition.

- **Rehearsal** a. Each choir will have at least one rehearsal slot at the venue on the day of the performance.
 - b. Also, the authorized travel agency will book a rehearsal room in the city for the choirs.
 - c. Up to 2 members of each choir may inspect the competition hall on the day before the performance.

- Copyright a. Copyright royalties for works managed by the Japanese Society for Rights of Authors, Composers and Publishers (JASRAC) or NexTone Inc. will be paid by the Organiser. For other songs, the choirs must obtain permission from the copyright holder by themselves.
 - b. If the choir partially edit or arrange the work, they must obtain prior approval from the copyright holder and submit a written proof of permission to the Organiser. Negotiations with copyright holders must be handled by the competitors.
 - c. If problems arise between a choir and the copyright holder for a song that requires copyright procedures, it must be handled solely under the responsibility of the choir.

Information

- **Use of** a. The information provided by the participating choirs may be used for purposes related to the organisation of the competition, such as posting on websites, printing in publications, recording to CDs or DVDs, and provided to the mass media and parties involved in the management of the competition.
 - b. The Organiser or the authorized entities may use pictures, audio and video recordings on the Internet, in publications and broadcast, and provide the information to the mass media. The authorised entities may also sell pictures and recordings in the form of photos, CDs or DVDs.



Conditions of Participation

Preliminary Choirs must pass the Preliminary Screening in order to be eligible for the competition. **Screening** Some choirs may be qualified on the recommendation of the Organiser.

Applications for the Preliminary Screening;

- a. An Application form written in English
- b. A recent audio recording of the choir recorded by 2-16 intended singers, after April 2025.
 - *The screening process will be conducted anonymously. Therefore, the choir's name and any other sounds except for the performance must not be recorded.
 - *The performance time shall be within 9 minutes, and the choral pieces may be different from those to be performed in the competition. Each piece must be recorded on a separate track.
 - *The mixing of recorded sound is prohibited for the fair screening.
 - *The recording media shall be a CD (CD-DA format). DVDs are not acceptable. The recording media will not be returned.
- c. One digital photo showing the choir

Application Deadline: 30 September 2025

*The result of the Preliminary Screening will be announced by <u>31 October 2025</u> at the latest.

Registration Qualified Choirs must submit the following documents.

Registration Documents;

- a. Fully completed registration forms.
- b. A bank cheque or proof of bank transfer covering the participation fee (only if bank transfer is selected).
- c. 7 original scores for the Category Competition

Registration Deadline: a. & b. 1 December 2025 / c. 23 December 2025

*The mailing address will be announced later.

Immigration Upon entering the country, it is necessary to follow the entry procedures specified by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Japan.

Participation For participation in the competition, a non-refundable participation fee of JPY 30,000 must be paid per choir after passing the Preliminary Screening.

The participation fee of JPY 30,000 covers;

- a. Admission tickets to the competitions for all choir members including conductors and accompanists
- b. Programme booklet and Commemorative gift (clear folder) for all choir member
- c. CDs and DVDs recorded by the authorised agent
- d. Photos taken by the authorised agent
- e. Rehearsal room fee
- f. English guide

Payment Methods;

Payment Deadline: 1 December 2025

Accommodation/ The participating choirs will be responsible for their own expenses of travel and Meals / accommodation.

Financial Choirs selected for the Grand Champion Competition will receive financial assistance of Assistance up to JPY 7,000 per hotel stay after being selected for the finals for each choir member, including the conductor and the accompanist.

Application of Visa

- Admission/ a. Please note that all applicants will be admitted as a participant and obtain visarelated documents issued by the Organiser only after fully completed registration forms and payments have been received.
 - b. The authorised travel agency will, upon request, arrange accommodations for nonperformers and issue documents for visa applications as a tourist, but only when fully completed applications and payments have been received.


